

## What Will Disrupt Health Care in 2019? Catch Up on Recent Symposium and Webinar

A standing room only audience received topline findings from a futuristic, crystal-ball study on [Trends in Health Care: Disruptors and Opportunities](#) at the our Annual Research Symposium Oct. 22. The event was held prior to AMCP Nexus in Orlando, FL.

The keynote speaker was Reed Tuckson, MD, former EVP & Chief of Medical Affairs, UnitedHealth Group. Tuckson recapped his talk on realizing comprehensive, multidisciplinary integrated health care in our Dec. 5 webinar. [View archived presentation.](#)



[New findings on health care trends](#) were presented. Six overarching trends and two global influencers were examined: affordability and value; innovative and curative therapies; optimal health coverage; industry consolidation; population health management; expedited drug approval; social determinants of health; and technology.

According to a research survey of health care stakeholders, drug pricing was identified as having the most impact on health care's future, with 93 percent of respondents classifying it as "very or extremely impactful," followed closely by innovative and curative therapies (88 percent) and industry consolidation (80 percent). Overwhelmingly, respondents also considered the lack of transparency in drug pricing be the top barrier to care, and believed that evidence-based medicine (97 percent of respondents) and value-based contracting were viable solutions to address the issue moving forward.

The Symposium was [moderated by Kevin Sneed](#), PharmD, Dean of the University of South Florida College of Pharmacy.
