- 20 teams across two campuses
- Participants receive course credit
- Competition and banquet hosted in early January



P&T Competition Coordinator

- 1. Market and recruit early
 - Market to students
 - Course credit, Testimonials, Personal outreach
 - Recruit committee members
 - Previous P&T experience?
 - Recruit judges
 - Work with adviser, chapter diplomat, office of alumni relations

P&T Competition Coordinator

- 2. Secure funding
 - Prepare a budget at the start of the year
 - Explore opportunities through school/college and local pharmaceutical companies/managed care organizations (MCO's)



P&T Competition Coordinator

- 3. Prepare competitors (and judges)
 - Provide high-level introduction to resources and topics
 - Leverage pharmacy curriculum & faculty
 - Collect feedback from competitors and share them with speakers

P&T Competition Coordinator

- 4. Coordinate Competition Day
 - Maintain consistent communication with judges and competitors
 - Divide responsibility between committee members
 - Be prepared for the unexpected



P&T Competition Coordinator

- 5. Document, document!
 - Utilize a shared drive or coordinator specific email to keep track of documents & communication
 - Collect feedback from competitors, speakers, judges, and committee members
 - Develop a transition guide to incoming coordinator

P&T COMPETITION JUDGE TIPS





TEAMWORK

- Pick team members that leverage
- each others strengths.
 Distribute work among team
 Each team member presents and
 can answer questions.



FACULTY MENTOR

Engage faculty mentor to assist with overall concepts that the team needs to learn.



PLAN

- Have a game plan!

 - Team lead
 Distribution of work
 Team meeting times
 Tying it together.



RESEARCH

- Thoroughly research your drug, both in the US and globally (where possible).
 Wisely chose keywords for search.
 Chose multiple resource databases.



DOUBLE CHECK

- Prior to turning in submission, double check your work.

 Check for staying within competition



PRACTICE, PRACTICE, PRACTICE

- Practice presenting key points and
- answering questions.

 <u>Every team member</u> needs to contribute.

Staff Tips

- 57 chapters registered (7 new institutions)
- 42% of respondents to 2016 survey found the package insert information very useful
- 61% exported slides from the dossier
- Has anyone at your school completed the CER certificate program?
- Give a very detailed recommendation, including target population, prior authorization criteria, quantity limit, and step therapy criteria
- Try a "buddy system" at your school with prior competitors (even alumni!)
- Ask local judges to provide written feedback that can be shared with teams

Consider your appearance when presenting

"This has, hands down, been the best experience I've had in pharmacy school. The major feedback that I left the competition thinking about was the emphasis on the verbal presentation. We got very good praise on our presentation. When we watched other teams give presentations that were lacking, it made me realize that no matter the written work and actual recommendation, a submission won't be looked upon favorably if it not presented well."

"Encourage universities to train judges and students early in the year. Students need to have an opportunity to see a model P&T presentation and actual prior authorization criteria."
